He started off his career at the Port Elizabeth Technikon as the HOD Co-operative Education and Service Learning and moved on to the position of Director: Industrial Liaison. During the 2005 merger process resulting in the formation of the Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University in 2008 he was appointed as Director: Engagement. He was instrumental in developing the current centralised institutional Engagement Office structure and related policies.

Included amongst these were policies relating to partnership development and engagement. They include the University's e policy on Work integrated learning, Service Learning, Programme Advisory Committees, Short Learning Programmes and Non-Formal Education, The Establishment and Review of University Research & Engagement Entities, Engagement Policy as well as Engagement Recognition and Reward Criteria of the institution.
