She is a C2 NRF rated researcher and has obtained 7 Theology degrees which include two doctorates. One in Church Polity and the other in Pastoral Counselling. She is the Editor of the accredited journal Studia Historiae Ecclesiasticae of the Church History Society of Southern Africa, as well as an Editor of the Special Collection Social Memory Studies. She has published several books and articles on Church History, Oral History and Gender Studies.

In 2004 she won the Christian Booksellers of South Africa "Book of the Year Award" for "Leefstyl-Bybel vir Vroue", in 2007 she won "The Most Published Woman at Unisa (2005)" Award and in 2010 she won the CEO Women of the Year award (Education and training). She is an ordained minister of the Word in the Uniting Reformed Church in Southern Africa ministering in Rustenburg-Karlienpark.


